

Findon Sheep Fair - Saturday 13th September 2025 - Details

Sheep Judging Details: -

Entry cost per farm: £8:00 per pen (without straw)
Fleece entries - no charge, but must have a sheep entry in the main section.

Pens will be labelled with a number and flock or farm name and we will be happy for you to add your own descriptive material to the sides of the pens as usual.

UK Rare & Native Breeds and Continental & Foreign Breeds of sheep may be entered according to their breeds. Allocation to the appropriate section will be done by the organisers who reserve the right to allocate to a general section in the event of insufficient numbers being entered for an individual breed section.

Entries for the "group of three" class must all be of the same breed, consist of two of one sex and one of the other and have all been shown in individual classes earlier in the day.

For the Fleece section fleeces should be rolled and labelled with the class and owner's name. If you wish us to sell the fleece after the judging, please indicate a price on the back of the label.

There will be trophies in certain sections and classes, as shown below, together with money prizes and rosettes for all classes and sections.

Judging times and parking details (arrival by 9:15 latest) will be sent to you after entry.
Judges decision is final.
